

### Bukchon Traditional Craft





## K-ETA

Applicants from a country where Korea has a visa-waiver agreement may participate in Hongik International Summer School with the K-ETA (Korea Electronic Travel Authorization).

Make sure that Visa-free visitors still must obtain K-ETA approval before entering Korea.

## C-3 visa

Applicants from a country that is excluded from the visa-waiver agreement with Korea must [apply for a C-3-1 \(short-term\) or a C-3-9 \(tourist\) Visa](#) at the Korean Embassy or Korean Consulate Office in the country where the home university belongs.

Obtaining a Visa can be time-consuming, so we strongly recommend that applicants prepare for their correct visa in advance.

Applicant has a responsibility to receive the correct visa to stay in Korea, so consult the Korean Embassy in your country as early as possible.




